



## Smarter Pot Size Chart – With Watering Guide

Pot sizes can be confusing, especially when dealing with litres and diameters. This chart groups common nursery pot sizes into simple categories to make plant care and repotting easier.

### Quick Reference Chart:

Pot Size (L)	Approx. Diameter	Nickname	Best For	Watering Guide (ml) 10–15% of volume
0.5L	9 cm / 3.5"	Tiny	Propagation, baby plants	50–75 ml
0.7L	12 cm / 4.5"	Mini	Small cuttings, young plants	70–105 ml
1L	13 cm / 5"	Starter	Seedlings, established cuttings	100–150 ml
2L–4L	17–20 cm / 6.5–8"	Small	Herbs, small foliage plants	200–600 ml
5L–7L	22–25 cm / 9–10"	Medium	Established houseplants	500–1,050 ml
10L–15L	28–33 cm / 11–13"	Large	Ferns, Monstera, Rubber Plants	1–2.25 L
20L+	35+ cm / 14"+	XL	Palms, Fiddle Leaf Figs, floor plants	2–3+ L

 Pro tip: Save this chart to your phone for those garden centre trips when you're standing there trying to figure out what size you actually need!

 NOTE: These sizes are a general guide only — pot measurements may vary between manufacturers. Most pots are measured across the top outer diameter.
